- I) in the case of a concert, include a copy of the poster containing clear information about the venue of the concert, date, performers, and program;
- m) in the case of being a member of the jury in a music competition, provide confirmation from the organizer of membership;

- o) in the case of recordings, provide a photocopy of the recording cover, which clearly indicates information about the publisher, performers, and presented repertoire;
- p) confirmation of the presentation of artistic or project works in the discipline of visual arts and conservation of artworks during: individual exhibition, group exhibition including post-competition exhibitions: documentation of the event: poster, photographic documentation, media information, catalog;
